Arrggg...What Can I Do With My Kids? The Power of Receptive Parenting Versus Reactive Parenting

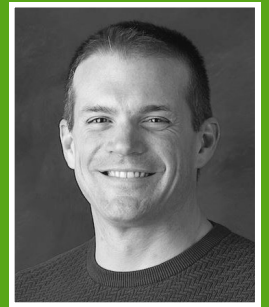
