Time to Get the Schools on Board

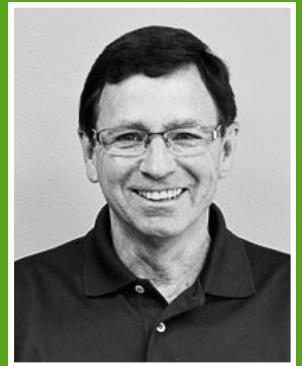
